A MESSAGE FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER, **KATIE SHORTER**

Happy Spring to all of our members!



I want to begin this greeting by thanking all of our members for continuing to be committed to your club. Last year, our golf course en-

dured over 82 inches of rain, not the mention the effects of Hurricanes Florence and Michael. The first few months of 2019 have not been very kind, either, and the recovery process will continue in the coming months.

Throughout 2018, there were many improvements at the Club, some visible and some behind the scenes. All of them were necessary to stabilize operations and to improve and add value to the daily experience of our members. The core management staff of Kathy, Shannon, Mike, Tom, Jason, Matthew, and Renee are committed to delivering a consistent and attentive level of service to our members.

Taberna Country Club remains available for purchase, which represents a challenge going forward. There have been a few interested parties over the last calendar year, but – to date – nothing has materialized in the way of a sale. Florence's arrival did nothing to help the course's marketability, and – two years after the ownership made a

plea to the Taberna community – the future of the Club still remains uncertain. The combination of the golfers and non-golfers who stepped up to support the Club created a strong enough membership base to move the Club into a state of profitability. However, the Club has experienced attrition over the last year, some of which has not been replenished with new members, especially golfing members. The good news is that the attrition has not been due to dissatisfaction as in previous years; rather, it has been almost entirely due to our members moving out of the area or being unable to use their membership due to age-related health issues. I have done what I was hired to do – stabilize operations within the budgetary constraints placed on me and return the Club to profitability to prepare it for sale. I have been very committed to making any and all incremental improvements possible out of my operating income – as there has been very little capital provided by the owners – while being cognizant of the bottom line in order to keep the Club looking attractive for prospective buyers.

Historically, the Club has had three revenue centers – the Golf Shop, Food and Beverage, and membership dues. Golf Shops nationwide are transitioning out of a revenue center and are more of a member amenity. The presence of golf merchandise sites on the internet, bricks and mortar stores, and

easy access to deep discounts on almost everything related to golf are making the traditional Golf Shop model obsolete. Aside from providing some basic golf necessities and specialty logo items along with some special order items, the golf shop no longer serves as a profit center for most private, non-destination golf courses. So, in an effort to offset this and to generate more revenue for the Club, I have pursued a more aggressive Food and Beverage model. ALL members' dues are important to the viability of the Club. While the golfer dues are imperative for the Club's survival, the food and beverage area and the other members who support the Club elsewhere are vital to the Club's sustainability. Taberna Country Club, as a venue, is underutilized as a potential source of additional revenue. Lunch meetings, dinner events, special events, weddings, etc. are all underdeveloped sources of revenue for the Club and will continue to be pursued, even when they occasionally conflict with member use of the Clubhouse and dining room.

Going forward, it is time to increase our golf course utilization. With the hire of Head Golf Pro Jason Hammel, who is accustomed to managing this type of model, we are aptly equipped to welcome non-member golfers to our course during the times that our members do not play yet other golfers

Hole # 16 Tee Box is looking great! If you have played recently, you probably have noticed the added height to the tee box to help the extremely wet conditions it sees after a heavy rain. We are paying close attention to what the water does right after it does rain. We do have options for more drainage after we get a good sample of

weather to see where the water goes.


Star Performers of the Month!

The optimum sustainment model is a new owner who is willing to make the targeted capital investments necessary to move the course and club forward and upward. My hope is that the current owners will choose to focus the time and energy necessary to secure a new owner, who will be welcomed by the great community that is Taberna Country Club.



Friday will host a 4:00 PM, 9 Hole Par 3 Tournament (Optional)

The Champions Dinner will be hosted by the 2018 Masters Champion, Dana Sagan, following play of the Par 3 Tournament, with Cocktails and a Plated Dinner (Approx 6 PM). After Dinner, we will draw names of PGA Tour players to assign to everyone participating in the Masters Tournament!

The Greens Committee had their monthly meeting on Thursday, March 28, 2019. Members of the committee are excited at the prospect of warmer temperatures, greener fairways and more opportunities to be outdoors with our friends, enjoying the beauty of our course.

Over the winter months Wade and his crew have been busy cleaning up from Hurricane Florence as well as working on projects to enhance our playing experience. Many bunkers have had new drains installed, pre-emergent has been applied and all wetlands have been cut back.

You will notice the tee box on #16 has been raised and sodded. This is an attempt to remediate the standing water issue that has plagued hole #16 for quite some time.

The forward tee on hole #4 will be enlarged and sodded

to enable both the red and black tees to play from that distance.

Fertilization will take place on Monday, April 8th and aeration will take place the following Monday and Tuesday, April 15-16. On Monday, April 22, weather permitting, Wade will work with a backhoe to fix the large sink holes on hole #1 and hole #3. They have become quite deep and need to be addressed ASAP.

A "Divot Party" will take place on Monday, April 22nd starting at 2:30 pm. Any golf member wishing to volunteer to help fill in fairway divots are welcome to attend. Light refreshments will follow.
