DRAINAGE ISSUES PROJECT REMEDIED



Wade's words...



The drainage issues on holes 1 and 3 were addressed, as the sink holes were growing larger and deeper. When the project started, we had no idea what we were going to unearth but knew the drainage pipes were deeper than anything the maintenance crew could handle without large equipment. In the end, the drainage pipes were deeper than 10 feet underground (see pictures), and up to 20 feet of damaged pipe had to be replaced in each hole. On hole 3, there was an 18-inch city pipe under our pipe which was also damaged and had to be patched. Our 8 inch,

dual wall pipes had been either crushed or split over time. Once the damaged piping was excavated, we used clam shell couplers to join the new piping into the old, and had over 10 tons of rock brought in to surround the new piping for support. Without the help of Cieszko Construction (thank you Tabernian and TCC member Martin Cieszko), this very large and involved project never could have been completed so quickly, safely and effectively. Thank you to the members for your patience for the few days that the equipment was on the course.



If you didn't get your golf in during the month of May, it wasn't the weather's fault! We have seen some beautiful weather this past month for all the

golfing you can handle. Temperatures have been a little warm, which our fairways would admit to, but the golf course is in great shape and keeps getting better. The greens have been fully healed from our aeration and are rolling true. If and when we do get a little rain, this course is going to look amazing!

Our Spring Member-Member was a huge success, and next on the Tournament Schedule is our Annual Member-Guest Weekend! This year has a "casino" theme with on-course betting, 5-star menu items, a casino party after all the golf on Saturday, and much more!
