THE TENNIS CORNER

WITH BARBARA FLYNN



In August, New Bern experienced Hurricane Isaias and, fortunately, the area received very little damage. Taberna Country Club came through the storm pretty much unscathed. However, the tennis courts lost a net pole on Court 3 and seven lights are currently out.

Scot Campbell, General Manager, will develop a plan to make the necessary repairs to bring the courts fully up to speed.

Given the earlier arrival of darkness in the Fall and Winter, the Monday and Wednesday women's tennis groups are starting play at 5:30 p.m.

US Open from what I am reading in Tennis Magazine, is still scheduled for August 31 – September 13 with the French Open just 14 days later. While the US Open will be played fan free, the French Open will be played in front of 50-60 percent of its normal occupancy.

On the men's side of the US Open, defending champion Novak Djokovic will be coming to New York. He has fully recovered from Covid-19. Number 2

ranked Rafael Nadal is skipping the tournament due to Covid concern. Roger Federer is still recuperating from two operations on his right knee. Others not playing are: Stan Wawrinka, Nick Kyrgios, and Gael Monfils.

On the women's side, defending champion Canadian Bianca Andreescu pulled out of the US Open in wake of the coronavirus pandemic. She is joined by #1 ranked Ash Barty, Elina Svitolina, Kiki Bertens. The good news is that Serena Williams is committed to play. Also, Kim Clijsters has received a wild card entry.

Lastly, after winning her first WTA trophy of her career in Lexington, Kentucky (the first pro tennis event in the US since the start of the coronavirus pandemic), is now in line to be seeded for the US Open.
