## THE TENNIS CORNER

WITH BARBARA FLYNN

### OPEN TENNIS DATES AND TIMES

Sunday 12:30 pm

Tuesday 6:15 pm

Now that it is January, and we are in the winter months, the ability to play tennis here at Taberna is limited by the weather – namely the colder and, recently, extremely wet weather. If we cannot play tennis at least we can watch it on TV, such as the Australian Open.

The 2021 Australian Open is the first grand slam of 2021. This year the tournament is scheduled for mid-February (2/8 – 2/21) in Melbourne, weeks later than its traditional end of January date. Qualifying matches will be held in Doha January 10 – 13 with weeks between qualifying and the tournament set aside for travel and covid-19 quarantining. Players will be subjected to "an extremely rigorous testing regime" before and after arriving in Melbourne.

Last year the Australian Open was the only one of the four major tennis tournaments to proceed as normal.

**Maintenance of Your Racquet** — Having discussed last month how often to get your racquet restrung, and string gauge and tension, the next consideration is the string types:

1. Natural gut: Most expensive; most powerful string available; holds tension the best; remains soft at high tensions; arm friendliness – is superior to all synthetic strings
2. Tournament nylon: Cheapest string suited for complete beginners
3. Synthetic gut: Most commonly used; 75% of all club players are using it; made of nylon but not to be confused with tournament nylon.
4. Multifilament: More expensive; holds tension better; higher elasticity; more powerful; softer which makes it easier on the arm – good choice for seniors

There are five or six other string types available, but those of us who play regularly would rely on those strings listed first.
