Also, coming up this month, we will aerate the greens (this happens TWICE a year) on April 12th and 13th (Monday – Tuesday) when the ENTIRE Golf Course will be closed (Golf Course, Dining Room, Putting Green, Practice Facilities, Pool, etc.). The Tennis Facility will remain open through the closure of the rest of the Golf Course Facilities.

Hello, everyone, Happy Spring! The temperature is rising and the course is starting to dry out. Every day the course is getting a little greener so it won't be long before it should be fully greened up and ready for play!.

We will be aerifying greens Monday & Tuesday, April 12th & 13th, and the course will be fertilized during this time with an organic slow release fertilizer that is in the parking lot at a rate of 750 pounds per acre . The greens should heal up in a few weeks following aerification so we can provide the best overall playing experience this summer.

Please remember to fix those ball mark on the greens, fill those divots in the fairways and adhere to the 90 degree cart rule and follow the cart path as long as you can before going out to the fairway. This will help reduce the cart traffic and preserve the turf.










🙊 Remembering Glen Killian... 🙊



It is with great sadness that we acknowledge the passing of a true Taberna pioneer, Master Gunnery Sergeant Vernon Glen Killian, USMC (Ret). Glen and Sylvia Killian were among the first homeowners in Taberna, and they contributed greatly in making the community what it is today. Glen was born and raised in Oklahoma, enlisting in the

Marine Corps out of high school. He thus joined his three brothers, all of whom were in military service. While in the Corps, Glen served as an embassy guard in Indonesia and Japan, where he met Sylvia, then working in the US Embassy. He transitioned into aviation and served two tours in Viet Nam as a Phantom mechanic. He later moved to helicopters and eventually was assigned to HMX 1, the Marine One Squadron. Here he served four presidents, from Nixon to Reagan and rose to be Crew Chief of Marine One. Following retirement after 28+ years of service, he continued in aviation as a consultant dealing with maintenance configuration of military helicopters.

Glen was an avid golfer and served on the Marine Corps Golf Team. Moving to Taberna in the late nineties, he immediately became active in the golf scene, helping organize what is now the Taberna Men's Golf Association. He also become a member of the Taberna HOA board, serving for many years on the building and grounds committee.

Glen continued his service to Marines as the organizer of the Taberna Marine Corp Mess. On November 10 each year, he organized the Annual Marine Corps Birthday Ball in Taberna, attended by all Taberna Marine veterans. Glen was a strong advocate for all veterans, as a member of the VFW and the American Legion. He joined the Elks and its Veterans Committee, to continue his veterans activities, especially serving the residents of the State Veterans Nursing Home in Kinston.

He had a special love for the American flag, serving both Taberna and the Elks Lodge as chair of the flag committee. As an Elk, he helped organize the annual Salute to the Flag held each year at the Union Point Park Gazebo.

Glen and Sylvia Killian will both be missed for all they gave to Taberna, to New Bern, and to veterans. Rest in peace, Glen and Sylvia.

A Celebration of Life Service will be held at Taberna Country Club on Tuesday, April 13th at 4:00 PM. Friends of Glen are invited to attend. A reception will follow the service. Interment will take place at a later date.


