

Members in the United States Senate have also introduced a bipartisan companion bill. An individual woman has never received this award. In my efforts to find out if the bill has been passed, I did find a report (dated October 7, 2023) on the website "govtrack" stating that the bill only has a 10% chance of getting enacted. Thus,

we should all contact Congressman Greg Murphy and encourage him to become a co-sponsor of H.R.1831 as well as Senator Thom Tillis and Senator Ted Budd to co-sponsor S.2861. Apparently, H. R. only has 88 co-sponsors which is not enough.
