Hello, Members! Spring is finally in the air! After what seemed like a very, very long winter, the days are getting longer and warmer!

We are happy to let you all know that we are extending the hours in the dining room! Beginning April 1st, we will have the dining room and kitchen open 11am-7pm on Tuesdays and Wednesdays and 11AM-8PM Thursday through Saturday.

We have few new things added on to our menu and we have a couple of daily or weekly specials offered as well. We are also working on adding some dinner entrees to the menu.

During the next couple of months in the dining room we will be hosting:

- Easter brunch buffet on Sunday, April 20th;
- Mother's Day brunch buffet on Sunday, May 11th;

Father's Day buffet on Sunday, June 15th.

We will have several other events as well and I will be sending out details on all of them as they are closer.

The spring weather is also an indicator of pool season! We will be bringing back our Pool Only membership this year, as it was a big success last year! With 77 Pool Only members gained, we hope to welcome them all back.

Here are just a few things to remember:

Guests should pay the \$5.00 guest fee at the snack bar immediately upon entering the pool/as soon as the snack bar is open.

Pool hours of operation are 10AM-8PM daily; NO access before or after hours. The pool is monitored via camera.

Ages 14 and younger need to be accompanied by an adult.

Parents are expected to directly supervise their children at all times (with or without a lifeguard on duty) nonswimmers are to be in the kiddie pool, the shallow end, or within arms reach of an adult at all times.

No Smoking or Vaping within the pool fences.

Please do not move the umbrellas or umbrella stands; please ask a lifeguard for assistance.

The lifeguard room is for staff only.

Please do not flush anything other than TP in the toilets. They clog very easily. When they clog, the pool has to close until they can be fixed.

All users are expected to follow pool rules for safety. These rules are posted between the restrooms.

The snack bar will be open this pool season with limited hours and a limited menu. You are always welcome to call the restaurant to order food and it will be delivered to you poolside.

We will be hosting the Taberna Tiger Sharks again this pool season. Registration will be held at the club on May 4th from 4-6PM. Please reach out to Nancy Dixon for more information at nindix@aol.com.

The extended cold weather took away from golf, but I'm starting to see the green of emerging grass out on the course, even through the pollen clouds. Thanks to Wade and his crew, the course is looking great, and the greens are quickening as we roll into our 2025 season.

As the year is well underway, let's recap a couple of significant events:

It was a tough battle, but Peanut Butter and Jelly donations ended in a jelly come from behind victory at PB - 85 and J - 95. Full Disclosure: Jelly only won because the church needed more ielly, so I used the cash donations to buy jelly. Thank you to all who donated, and special thanks to those who had to tolerate my emails, when they just wanted to know if they were "Cart Path Only" for the day! I haven't seen Two Rivers' final tally yet, but they were well over the 1k (1,000) target for each.

With public play, we partnered with GolfNow (website accessible), and so far, results have been favorable. We average two public golfers daily and, while our Rounds of Golf were down 1,527 from last year, our revenue was up over 11K from last year's numbers. Thank you as members for setting the example

on the course by raking bunkers, filling divots, repairing ball marks and following the 90-degree and other course rules. We are still restraining them to no earlier than 1PM, and our "Hidden Gem" is being successfully shared with hopefully transparent impact to our Members.

GOLF TIPS FROM STEVE SEWELL

"THE VERTICAL PLANE"



The last tip focused on the horizontal plane, the core, the turn, rotation, pivot, weight transfer, etc. This time I'll address the ver-

tical plane which is comprised of golf club, hands, arms and shoulders. Both planes offer constant factors to the swing since they cannot be overdone, therefore they are NOT variable! A proper swing plane is almost vertical, but more accurately described it is very similar to the tilt wheel ride we see at county fairs. When the vertical plane is correct, hands and club remain in front of the player. If we envision a wall approximately six inches behind us as we address the ball; we expect the club to ride the wall, possibly making a mark on the wall, but not going around us as a baseball bat does, which would put a hole in the wall! Another way to view the club position is to set two clubs as railroad tracks: one parallel to the ball's intended line and the other parallel to the other club in front of your feet. This

setup should show a set of rail-road tracks. When you take your backswing, as the club reaches about waist high, (parallel to the ground), it should be positioned above the inner, or left track at your toes. You will not see a Tour player in other than this position for everyday routine golf shots! A popular golf comment is to swing inside out. That's correct,

swing inside out. That's correct, but incomplete. The full statement should be: inside out and PARALLEL to the line!

Hope this helps! Violation of this move is common and fatal.















THE TENNIS CORNER
